- 1. Review and presentation of Humboldt in Harmony proposed top goals. Susan See the attached attendance goals document.

We are changing some of the volunteer times to a later time since since we are getting more volunteers and repeat volunteers who know what to do. - 5. Pollinator Garden update from Lynn: Lynn has the plants ordered and well categorized . Plants are ordered from W. & E. Radke, Inc and MMSD. Radke will deliver. Richard offered to pick up from MMSD. Lynn is working with Steve Gallam for tilling of the ground. There will be a 3ft border between the windows and plants for access. June 7<sup>th</sup> will be planting with a few people to help things orderly. Will need weeding and watering volunteers.
- 6. Signage update from Susan: MCP will work on cleaning up the posts. Susan will post the wording and pictures for possible usage on the signs. Discussion of using a QR code to scan for more information or signing up as a member. Also, to later have the signage in more than one language.

- 7. Update on Dr. Newton from UWM FWS from Patrick: Students were eager to ask questions regarding what we expected of them from this project. They will sample the water quality and suggest possible ways to improve the conditions for a safer habitat.
- 8. Reforestation from Henry: There have been over 200 trees lost in the last 10 years, white ash, oaks and maples. Eagle Scout Connor Cram has submitted his plan for approval for helping protect trees and minimize weeds with brown paper bags and wood chips. Henry will keep outreaching with MCP regarding tree planting and maintenance.
- 9. Grant updates from Gary: Gary has applied for AARP Walk Audits. One suggestion is to go out and encourage people to take a walk in the park together at a certain time. People over 50 need a vibrant pubic space Humboldt Park. Possibility of improving Handicap Accessibility and getting some Senior activities like a Senior Public Art Project. We could find out in May or June if we are awarded a grant.
